

Walltree House



Thank you for booking with us and we're really looking forward to welcoming you to Walltree House Camping.

This is what you need to know to get here, check-in and to find your pitch, plus general site and safety information.

Getting to Walltree House Camping

If you're coming from Banbury or junction 11, you will find a road signposted Hinton Airfield just after the village of Farthinghoe, or just before the village if coming from Brackley. Follow that road for a mile and after a sharp corner take the right-hand fork. Half a mile further up you'll find the entrance to Walltree House grounds.

Follow the road onto the property and you'll see wooden signs directing you to camping. Carry along the road past Walltree House which will bend to the right, and then take the first left for the camping drop-off and parking area.

Check-in & out

Check-in is between 12-8pm

We are a self-check-in site, and you are free to arrive once full payment has been received and you have emailed acknowledgement and acceptance of the Walltree House Camping Rules and Terms & Conditions.

Check-out is by 11am

Please ensure you take all your belongings with you and dispose of any litter in the bins provided. The pitch should be left clear and clean.

Follow the countryside code - take nothing but photographs, leave nothing but footprints.

Getting to your pitch

Once you arrive to the camping area, you'll see a sign for drop-off. Pull in here as this is the easiest place to unload your luggage. Please return the wheelbarrows after use and leave upside down to keep dry. Once you've unloaded everything, continue to drive a little further along the road to the designated carpark area. No vehicles are to be parked on the camping field.

Please ensure you bring a torch as the site isn't lit and has uneven surfaces.

On the next page we have included a map of the site and all the cluster of pitches available to use.

All our clusters are named after planes that either once graced the tarmac during WWII or are currently in use on Hinton Airfield, which was built in 1939 by the Armed Forces.



Local shop & pub

By foot, the closest convenience store and pub (The Rose & Crown) is in the village of Charlton, which is approximately a 30-minute walk away. Larger supermarkets can be found in Brackley which is a 15-minute drive.

Café

For take-away drinks, breakfast baps and light bites there's a small café at the Skydive Centre on the airfield. Open 9am-5pm Tuesday-Friday (and bank holiday Mondays) and 8am-5pm Saturday and Sundays. Please note that it may be shut or close early on bad weather days.

Amenities

Freezer

Please feel free to use the freezer in the washing-up area. Ensure you remove anything stored here before you leave. Anything left in the freezer is at the risk of the guest, and please do not take anything that you did not put in.

Charging points

You'll also find charging points in the washing area, please use these whenever you need to. Anything left unattended here is at the risk of the guest. Do not remove anything from the charging point if it is not yours.

Picnic tables

There is a picnic table for each cluster to enjoy – it is not exclusive to any one pitch. Please be respectable to all guests who'd like to use it within the cluster, ensuring everyone has fair access. Please keep the picnic tables clean by clearing rubbish and spills. Do not remove the picnic tables from their cluster.

Fire pits

Each cluster has access to a shared fire pit and grill top. These are not for sole use by any one group, so please be mindful of other guests within your cluster and ensure everyone has fair use of it. Please look after the fire pits and leave them as you would like to find them. If you have cooked using the grill top, please make sure you clean it afterwards. Do not remove the fire pits from their cluster.

Firewood and fuel can only be purchased onsite. You'll find a stack of logs and natural firelighters in the washing area, and you can use the baskets provided to carry the logs to your fire pit. There's an honesty box for cash payment. Please return the baskets for other guests to use.

Fire safety

In the event of a fire please remain calm and follow these instructions:

- Raise the alarm.
- Ensure the area is evacuated.
- If safe, use the water bucket to extinguish fire.
- Do not take risks.
- Call the fire brigade (999) if necessary.

No Entry areas

We have some great historic WWII air raid shelters and structures on the camping field which we want you to enjoy, but these are not safe to access. Under no circumstances go into or onto these structures which are clearly signposted 'No Entry'. Anyone doing so, is doing it at their own risk and Walltree House is not liable for any accidents or injuries that may occur.

Airfield safety

Please be aware that the airfield is active. Do not walk on the airfield and keep to the public footpaths.
